Preserving our Military Heritage

The military has been an integral part of the defence and daily life of Halifax since its founding in 1749, with the city and adjoining communities serving as Canada's Atlantic sentinel through war and peace.

Commencing in the mid 1700s, the city's founders developed an extensive defence complex to protect residents and vital port facilities from land and sea attack. On the Halifax Peninsula, the complex includes Citadel Hill and Fort Needham, plus several batteries and Prince of Wales Tower in Point Pleasant Park. Off the peninsula, it extends west around the Northwest Arm to York Redoubt overlooking the harbour entrance; Bedford Basin; Georges Island; McNabs Island and eastward on the Dartmouth side to Eastern Passage. The Citadel, Prince of Wales Tower, Georges Island, McNabs Island and York Redoubt are National Historic Sites.

The Halifax Military Heritage Preservation Society is a volunteer educational society that promotes public awareness and appreciation for Halifax's rich military heritage, including military organizations, personalities and events that have shaped the city from its founding to the present.

The objectives of the volunteer, non-profit Halifax Military Heritage Preservation Society are:

- Research, document and promote public awareness and appreciation for Halifax's rich military heritage including military personalities and organizations that have shaped Halifax from its founding to the present;
